I appreciate that Daren mentioned carrying capacity as part of what determines ungulate populations. Ungulate populations are determined by complex factors and are not just a singular problem of too many predators. The new legislation that requires the DWR to act when ungulate populations are less than management goals completely neglects basic ecological principles. Simply removing predators from the equation does not accomplish anything, but it will result in a cascade of unintended ecological consequences.

Justifying cougar harvest by noting ungulate population decline is nonsensical and unethical.

I heard no mention of Chronic Wasting Disease in Daren's presentation. The DWR is willing to spend thousands (maybe millions?) on this problem, when a free solution is within its control. Allow cougars to thrive and they will reduce the spread of CWD.
