The way I see it, the any bull units in the state are already extremely challenging, extremely popular, extremely crowded. I don't see how changing this area to an LE hunt will be beneficial to LE point/tag holders, or OTC hunters. It seems it would result in more crowding on other any bull units, and a disappointing LE unit.

I'm not a biologist, and I don't try to be, so I depend on you all to provide us with the data that you collect year in and year out that backs up these changes and decisions. I'm not saying it's not there, or not real, but I sure don't see it as a part of the information provided here, which is supposed to help generate feedback on the proposals. Without any data showing that this would be beneficial to anybody except the state receiving some more LE tag fees, this feels like it's another way to bottleneck and restrict opportunity to hunt elk in Utah.
