Subject: 2022 Cooperative Wildlife Management Unit (CWMU) permit

recommendations

The following is a summary of the 2022 CWMU recommendations for antlerless permits/vouchers. There are three types of applications the DWR receives for CWMUs: new, renewal and change applications.

- The DWR received antlerless CWMU applications for 2022 and recommends the approval of all of them.
 - o 11 renewal applications
 - o 7 change applications that require Wildlife Board approval
 - o 3 new applications
- The following table summarizes the permits we are recommending be approved by the Wildlife Board for 2022:

Species	Private	Public
Antlerless elk	43	185
Doe pronghorn	4	6
Antlerless deer	0	25
Totals	47	216



• There will be a total of 69 CWMUs with antlerless permits for the 2022 hunting season, based on the DWR's recommendations. The following table summarizes the recommended number of antlerless CWMU permits statewide:

Species	Private	Public
Antlerless elk	130	1,079
Doe pronghorn	26	42
Antlerless deer	0	30
Total	156	1,151
