

Radio and GPS collars you will see on the Henry Mountain Bison





In January of 2011, 59 adult bison on the Henry Mountains Unit were captured and fitted with GPS and/or VHF radio collars for a long term research project. This represents approximately 20% of the adult population. During the duration of this study, sportsmen can make a huge difference by harvesting only non-collared bison. If you obtain a Henry Mountains bison permit, please avoid shooting a collared animal. If you do harvest a collared bison, capture crews will have to return to the area and collar another animal to maintain the necessary sample size. This would increase the expense of the study, which is ultimately funded by sportsmen. The approximate cost of capturing and collaring a bison is about \$1000. You should also be aware that the cape of a harvested, collared bison could be damaged, which is another good reason to select a non-collared animal.
