

“What Is the Apex Expansion Project?”

Kern River Gas Transmission Company's Apex Expansion Project, a new 28-mile, 36-inch diameter natural gas pipeline through the Wasatch Mountains in Morgan, Davis and Salt Lake Counties of northern Utah including the East Canyon Wildlife Management Area, will begin construction on October 1, 2010.

Kern River's existing 1,680-mile pipeline system runs from southwestern Wyoming to southern California. In 2003, Kern River built a parallel (looped) pipeline along most of its existing mainline; however, a section of the pipeline through the Wasatch Mountains north of Salt Lake City was not looped. By looping this section, the Apex Expansion Project will increase system capacity to meet growing market demand and enhance service reliability for all Kern River customers.

SAFETY & ENVIRONMENT

Kern River's highest priority is the safety of the public and has a history of operating a safe and reliable pipeline system. Kern Rivers also strives to minimize impact to the environment and surrounding communities in all of its operations and projects. The company has worked with the UDWR to ensure that the short-term limitations created by construction activities in the ECWMA result in long-term benefits for all who use and enjoy the East Canyon Wildlife Management Area.



ESTIMATED TIMELINE

- September 2010** - Change in access points into ECWMA will be in effect
- October 1, 2010** - Kern River begins pipeline construction
- November 2011** - Facilities in-service

- Beginning in September, a temporary access point to the ECWMA will be located east of the current access road.


- Hunting and camping will still be permitted. Hunters and campers should be aware that construction equipment could be located in the vicinity of the camping area.

- Nearly all of the disturbance areas will be located on the lower, southern portion of the ECWMA. The higher, northern portion of the property will not be affected.

MORE ACREAGE COMING SOON

Kern River, in cooperation with the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources (UDWR), has acquired 160 additional acres along the eastern boundary of the ECWMA.

This land, which will be permanently donated to the citizens of Utah, will be included within the ECWMA and available for hunting and other recreational purposes beginning in October 2010.
