Variances

The Division's authority to grant a variance consistent with the requirements of rule R657-57 is limited to persons that are completely or substantially precluded during the prescribed season from participating in the hunting activity authorized by an eligible wildlife document. ("Substantially precluded" means participating in no more than one hunt day during the prescribed hunting season because of qualifying event or condition.)

Qualifying events include:

- Personal illness or injury;
- The death, or significant injury or illness of an immediate family member;
- Or mobilization or deployment under orders of the United States Armed forces, a public health organization, or public safety organization in the interest of national defense or a national emergency.
- COVID-19 related personal health concerns or general public health restrictions imposed by the federal government, a state, or a local government.

Reinstatement of bonus or preference points- The Division may grant a variance by restoring bonus or preference points and waiving a waiting period for the following wildlife documents:

- General Season permits;
- Limited-entry permits;
- Public CWMU permits;
- Once-in-a-lifetime permits; and
- Any other hunt that triggers a waiting period to participate in a Division administered drawing.

Season Extensions-The Division may grant a season extension variance extending the hunting season on an applicant's wildlife document to the same or substantially similar hunt in the following year for the following wildlife documents:

- Once-in-a-lifetime permits;
- Conservation permits;
- Private limited-entry landowner permits;
- Wildlife expo permit;
- Poaching reported reward permits; and
- CWMU permits obtained through the operator or landowner.

Variance requests must be submitted to the Division within 120 days from the end of the season on the permit.

Please note:

There is a one-time only season extension for permits obtained through a UDWR drawing or a wildlife expo permit. For conservation permits, private CWMU permits or limited-entry Landowner Association (LOA) permits, there is a maximum of two times a season extension may be granted.
