

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES SECTION

- You can apply for the spring limited-entry turkey hunt from Dec. 12–27. Results will be available by Jan. 8.
- Reminder: All big game and antlerless hunts have mandatory harvest surveys (due within 30 days after the end of the hunt).



AQUATIC SECTION

- Anglers enjoyed great fishing this fall, and our annual monitoring work went well.
 Utah's recent above-average water years have been beneficial.
- It's almost time for ice fishing!
- Wondering where to fish this month?
 - For perch: Deer Creek, Echo, Starvation and Fish Lake
 - For trout: Scofield (just designated as a Blue Ribbon Fishery)
 - For boating anglers: Lake Powell (we're seeing higher numbers for all species)



HABITAT SECTION

- New habitat restoration projects for FY 2026 will be submitted on Jan. 10 in Utah's Watershed Restoration Initiative website.
- In FY 2024, we completed restoration work on 168,882 acres. Of that work,145,637 were proactive acres, which is the most we've ever done in one year.

 - Received over 540 tips from the public through our app and reporting hotline
 - Contacted over 15,000 people and checked more than 7,900 licenses
