I grew up literally on the Utah /Colorado east border Delores Triangle unit. hunting and fishing. Now that my son is seven and going with me all the time and loving hunting shed's and even just viewing the game where I grew up. Teaching him the areas and how to use the terrain to find animals when the don't want to be found. Utah is like Home to me even though we reside 7 miles onto Colorado. I have been doing the ethics course since it was started and following the rules/ closures. My son's first hunting permit was the shed antler gathering permit at 5 years old and highlighted the start of his hunting. I feel that if you're doing the ethics course you should be able to hunt year around as well. I'm not sure the fine for not having it but maybe increase the fines there instead of closing the opportunity for the first four months of the year for nonresidents. I'm not opposed to an annual permit fee for a year long tag like the small game / fishing licensing works. I also feel closing the opportunity to non residents might lower local revenues like tourism for persons that like to take trips to other states to shed hunt. I follow multiple YouTube/instagram /social media people/company's from Utah that video their hunting of sheds in multiple states and enjoy their content. I feel it makes people want to come to Utah for the adventure and possibilities of finding sheds as well. If you close it during peak drop times to non residents most wont come visit for that activity if they have to wait till its to hot to want to hike very far. Especially if I myself am coming to the state to watch the animals and where they might shed and scout out some plans to hunt them. To watch only the locals pick them up for the two months of fresh sheds before we can go. Sounds like a waste if time/ and money on my part to even scout or even visit the state.I'm also a dedicated hunter for the last 9 years and it making me think twice about applying for future tags as I like to shed hunt areas I hunt to find what might be in the area in the fall. If everything is mostly picked up by the time we can shed hunt and all I'm finding is 2 points tha got missed.
